MARCH MEETING — BEGINNERS' GET LUCKY

The March program was devoted to helping beginner anglers. Dinner tables were cleared, vests and rods were uncovered from under the tables and experienced anglers set about showing the beginners their use of their gear. Members who demonstrated the various uses of their vests showed the newbies the most useful flyfishing tools to use, assorted methods of keeping their fly boxes in their vests (and not floating down the river) and where to put lunches, first aid kits, rain gear and cap leashes.

Rods of different manufacturers and weights were displayed, and their applications discussed. EX: use low weight rods for smaller fish; a 4 or 5 wt. rod is a general all-purpose rod to use for trout in the rivers of Colorado. A 6 wt. rod is useful on windy days since its weight cuts through the wind better than the lower weight rods. Save that 2 or 3-weight for little cutthroat on streams. Some discussed the differences between slow flex rods, medium flex rods and fast action rods.

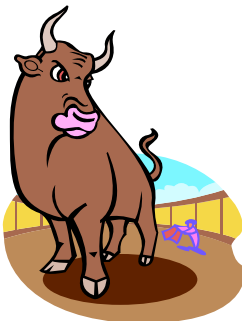

"Mother's Day Caddis Hatch" Weekend Trip April 26-27, Salida, CO

After our "warm-up" trip to the Blue, we will use the skills attained at the April CWF Clinic to entice the wild brown trout of the Arkansas. We feel our timing is right to hit the renowned

"Mother's Day Caddis Hatch," since this year high water flows mean warmer water — increasing the like-

lihood of an early caddis hatch!

This is an annual event that draws the biggest turnout, as over 50 members and guests flood the Salida area in search of beautiful, voracious browns and occasional rainbow trout.

Accommodations

Most of us stay at the Super 8 Motel in Salida, which has again provided us with a nice CWF-discounted rate of \$64.88/room. Call (719) 539-6689 and let them know

you are a CWF member to get this benefit. If you want to RV it, check out the 4 Seasons RV Park (719-539-3094).

Note that the Super 8 will be home base for the trip. If you are staying in a campground, another motel or somewhere else off campus, stop by the Super 8 if you want to coordinate fishing spots with other members.

What to Bring

You will want to bring a 4-, 5-, or 6-weight rod (it can get quite windy and the heavier rod can save the day) with 4 or 5x leader and 4 to 6x tippet. Dress in layers, as the weather can change, and you won't want to leave if the Blue Wing Olives start hatching.

Saturday Night Chili Cook-Off

The Chili Cook-Off will be at the same place as last year — the Senior Rec Center near the Super 8 Motel. There will be instructions on how to get there at the desk at the Super 8.

High Water Caution: At presstime, we have learned that heavy snows in the area will cause very high flows on the Arkansas in late April. I suggest members book at least one day of float fishing for that reason — it will be extremely difficult to wade out into the river, although there will still be good fishing at the edges. If ArkAnglers is fully booked, consider contacting the Royal Gorge Anglers in Canon City (719-269-3474) to arrange a float with his guides. Also, note that Bill Edrington will soon start to publish Arkansas River conditions two times daily on his website at www.royalgorgeanglers.com. — Anita English

SNEAK PEEKS

THE SOUTH PLATTE RIVER Deckers Area

Day Trip: Saturday, May 10

The South Platte below Cheesman Canyon has survived whirling disease, forest fires and rains that bring sludge into the river for miles below Deckers. Still, it is worth a trip. There are big fish that lurk in the canyon and between Deckers and the Wigwam Club. DOW stocks the lower river with "catchables."

A highly scientific study was conducted two years ago by Nancy Sherman and myself (she would go upstream and I would go down). We found the river section for several miles below Osprey Campground held many small willing fish in the 10" – 12" range. Nancy made a great map of the river below Deckers. We will have these to pass out on the day of the trip.

Bring a 5wt. rod, 4x or 5x leader and 4x to 6x tippet. Flies include black beauties, buckskins, RS 2s, pheasant tails, San Juan worm, brassies, BWOs and glo-bugs (eggs).

PELLA PONDS TRIP Boulder County, Colorado Day Trip: Saturday, May 24

Bass on a fly rod! What a hoot! Pella Ponds are located West of Longmont and just South of Hygiene (*in the Colo. Gazetteer on p.30*). The ponds are so small they don't show up on the map — but they fish BIG.

There are warm water species such as bluegill, perch,

crappie, smallmouth and largemouth bass. The bass will be guarding their nests so they should be very aggressive. And, there is always a chance of catching a fish *smaller* than the woolly buggie you are using.

Bring your 5wt. rod, 3X or 4X leaders and tippet. Sinking lines are best, but you can just sink a long leader with split shot. Flies include poppers (gaudy colored floating flies with big eyes and feather tails), woolly buggers, leaches, minnows and damsels.

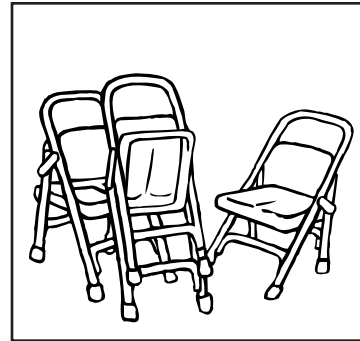
For those who would like to try floating, we will have some extra tubes and fins available.

To Begin

Here's what you need to do. If you are already a member of CWFTalk, do nothing. Now that we have a new roster, we will send out emails to the new members for whom we have an email address. The sender will be noreply@googlegroups.com. It will say you have been invited to join the members-only group for Colorado Women Flyfishers.

There will be two links. If you do not have an account on Google, you must click on the second one. It will take you to a page to create an account. You will enter your email address (they will not sell it) and a password. You will then get an email from account-noreply@googlegroups.com. This is to confirm so you have to click on the link (gibberish that is underlined). It will take you to a Thank you page. You close that and now you have a Google account.

Next Step

When you have a Google account, you can click on the first link in the email from noreply@googlegroups.com. This will confirm you want to join cwftalk.

Once you are a member, you can sign on to Google (account you set up previously). It will list cwftalk as one of your groups. You can go to cwftalk and read past emails, set up a profile and/or edit your membership.

This is the cool part. You can control how many emails you will get. Go to Edit Your Membership. You can select 1) you want no emails. Instead you will manually get on and read what is going on (not recommended). You may miss important trip information if you don't know to look for it; 2) get every email as it is posted or 3) my personal favorite, get a once a day summary of all the emails posted that day if any.

If you did not give Membership your email address, you may send it to me and I will get you an invitation.

San Juan River News

Nancy Sherman took a detour on her way back from visiting her stepfather in Ari-

zona in early March. She stopped off at Abe's Motel at the Navajo Dam and sent this information about the San Juan to members:

"If you were planning a trip to the San Juan River, NM (below Navajo Dam) in March or April and decided not to because of the 3,000 cfs flow, rethink that. I fished there for three days in early March and did well. With cleated boots and a wading staff, I was able to wade the Braids with no problems. There were no Blue Wing Olives, but the fish liked San Juan worms, a Rojo midge and a light BLUE egg. Visibility was about 15 to 18 inches. The flow will be raised to 5,000 cfs sometime in May, and float trips will be your only real option then." ♦

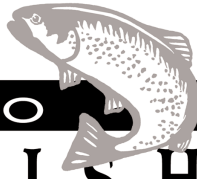
