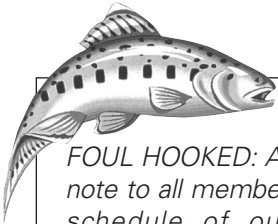

## BACK CAST

### APRIL MEETING -THE BLUE RIVER WITH NED PARKER

In typical fashion, the April presentation given by Ned Parker from Breckenridge Outfitters was packed full of useful information on fishing the Blue River, which coincided with our club trip the following weekend.

The area has a lot to offer in the way of fishing; plenty of river access, and Ned mentioned two lakes — Mohawk and Crystal. Each takes two hours to hike into (and back out), but receive very little angling pressure as a result of the effort it takes to get there. The lakes hold cutthroat trout, and ice-off occurs mid-May. If you are not faint of heart and decide to tackle the hike, make it early in the day. As with all of Colorado's high country, afternoon thunderstorms are a given, and are dangerous. Plan accordingly. The reward is fish that are not picky.

The majority of the presentation covered the Blue River from Breckenridge north to Green Mountain Reservoir and here is a brief recap.

#### From Breckenridge north to Dillon Reservoir, Colorado Highway 9

● In Breckenridge: the water is clear, and the fish are smart. Just north of Breckenridge, there are “stair steps” and plunge pools from stream improvements and the turbulent water holds large trout.

● Gold Hill Access across from Tiger Hill RV Park: after run-off this area is ‘on fire’.

● Swan Mountain Access: at the inlet to Dillon Reservoir, this is the last public section before the reservoir. It also has the best kokanee, brown, rainbow and cutthroat fishing.

#### From Dillon Dam for one mile north through Silverthorne, Colorado Highway 9

● Immediately below Dillon Reservoir: this is a famous Colorado tail-water fishery with educated fish usually requiring fluorocarbon leader and tippets, 6x even 7x. Try using a #18 mysis shrimp (or San Juan Worm or an egg) combined with a small nymph pattern typical for tail-waters. [Three decades ago the reservoir was stocked with mysis shrimp. The shrimp get sucked through the dam and die, floating downstream, turning white in the process. Use mysis shrimp patterns for approximately one mile downstream only. Their bodies disintegrate by this distance, and fish typically won't take those patterns.] When creeks get stirred up from snowmelt and summer rains, the bugs are often dislodged and the fish will swim into the stained water and feed like crazy.

● From the baseball fields to the Outlet Stores near Sixth Street bridge: tons of fish.

● Sixth Street at the Library: tons of fish, typically little fishing pressure.

#### From Silverthorne north to Green Mountain Reservoir, Colorado Highway 9

● Gravel Plant: fished often, but full of migratory fish.

● Sutton Unit: easy access and good water.

● Quaking Creek Bridge; cross the bridge and walk downstream. No angling pressure here!

● Blue River Campground: all public access and the water is nice, but the campground is closed to camping and parking due to beetle kill. Park along the highway.

● Just north of Blue River Campground: this is a very steep hike in and out. There are 30 feet deep runs here. Use 15 – 20 ft leader. The best Green Drake riffles are here. “Phenomenal fishing.” Look for the drakes starting the middle/end of June.

● Columbine Unit: Skip it. Rafters put in here.

● Palmer Gulch/Slate Hole: This is Ned's favorite place to fish...Palmer Gulch has five to six holes above the highway bridge. The western side of the river here is private; wade only half way into the river here. The private water above Slate Hole is stocked and “convicts escape and swim downstream into slate hole.”

● Old Heeney Bridge; don't walk on the bridge! There is a very deep hole underneath the bridge and it is easy access.

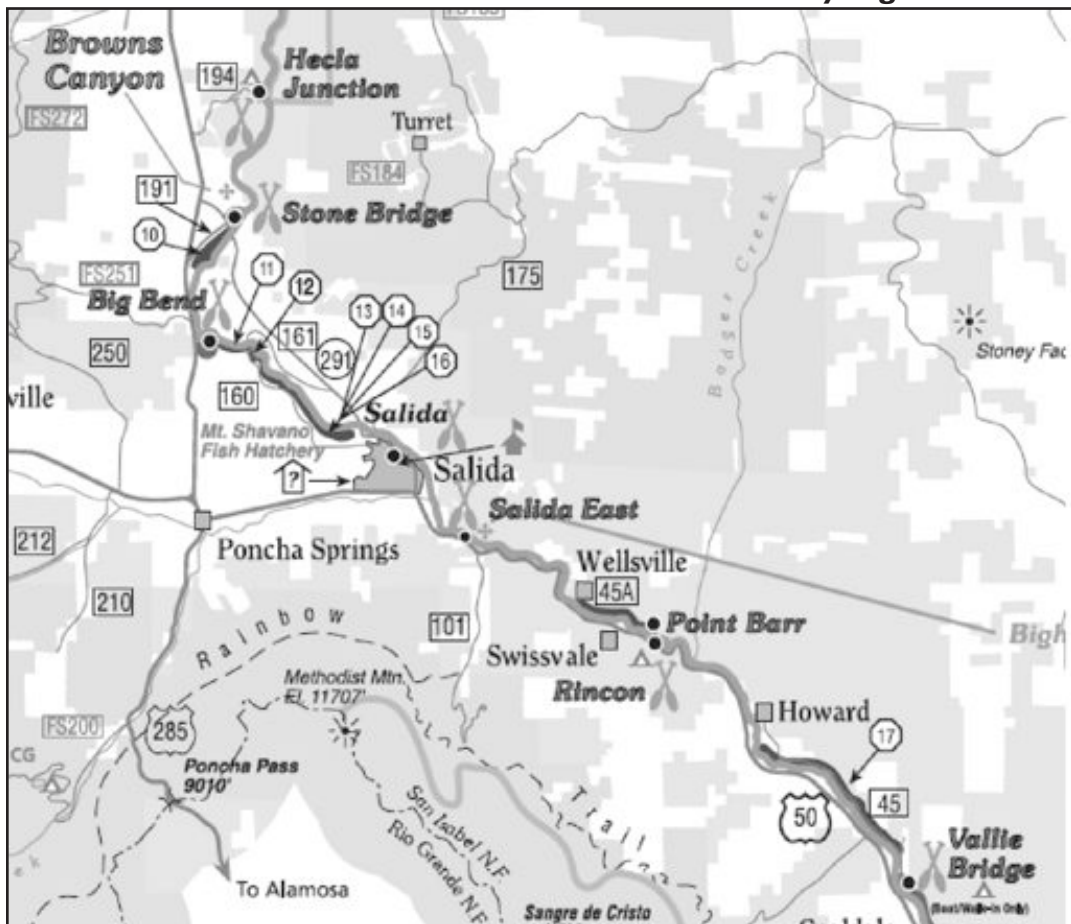
Meet at ArkAnglers parking lot at 8:00 a.m. and depart by 8:30 a.m.

## SNEAK PEEKS

### **ELEVEN MILE CANYON Near Lake George, CO Weekend Trip: June 4 - 5, 2011**

Since the Eleven Mile Canyon trip is within the first few days of June, it seemed like a good idea to get the information out to club in May. Eleven Mile Canyon is an outstanding tailwater fishery that holds nice brown and rainbow trout. The South Platte River flows from Eleven Mile Reservoir into Eleven Mile Canyon and access is from the bottom of the canyon in the town of Lake George off of U.S. Highway 24. Follow the signs and you will be fine. The top two miles of Eleven Mile Canyon are gold medal catch-and-release water. This part of Eleven Mile Canyon holds the greatest concentration and quality of trout, although there are lots of fish throughout the entire canyon. The trout feast on BWO's, PMD's and midge patterns. Dry fly fishing has been very good this year. Quite a few CWF members have been fishing this area since January and there have been twenty-fish trips several times.

The road to the top of the canyon is rough, so take it easy. Several CWF members will be camping at Spillway Campground (top of the canyon) while others are camping at the mouth of the canyon in the Blue Mountain Campground. You don't have to take up your whole weekend for the trip. This location is within a few hours of Denver so a day trip is not out of the question.

**Fee:** There is a \$5 day-use fee to enter the canyon (a one-time charge while you are camping). There is an annual pass available by mail or at the Entrance Station at Eleven Mile Canyon and Jefferson Lake during the regular season. Mail your check for \$45 to: Canyon Enterprises, Inc. P.O. Box 324, Divide, CO 80814. The Annual Pass is valid for day use at Elevenmile Canyon, Jefferson Lake, Twin Eagles Trailhead, Lost Park Trailhead, Kite Lake Trailhead, Manitou Lake, and Rampart Reservoir, as well as Decker's parking.

**Equipment:** 5 or 6 weight rods, 5X leaders and 5X/6X tippets.

*Flies:* BWO's, PMD's, and midge patterns all work. Pheasant Tails, emergers, black mayflies will get their attention. Ask your favorite fly shop what is working as the date gets closer and there will, of course, be updates posted on cwfTalk. *Clothes:* Dress in layers, wear sunscreen, and bring your polarized sunglasses!

#### **Meeting location on Saturday:**

Spillway Campground Site #16 at 8 a.m. Please don't park in the Spillway Campground unless you are camping there. There are parking areas for day fishers across from the entrance to the Spillway Campground and past the entrance near the dam. It is an easy walk to the campground from those locations. If you get there later in the morning or afternoon – look for the women having a great time and you will find us.

#### **NOTE: New Zealand Mud Snails.**

These fast-reproducing snails compete with the aquatic insects that

the trout feed on. Waders, boots and equipment should be soaked in a 50%-water and 50% specific 409 ("Commercial Solutions Formula 409® Cleaner Degreaser Disinfectant" or "Formula 409® All Purpose Cleaner Antibacterial Kitchen Fresh") for at least 5 minutes to kill the snails. Let's do our part to help prevent the invasive New Zealand Mud Snail from spreading to more of our Colorado trout streams.

There are 28 fishable miles of the Green River below Flaming Gorge Dam to the Colorado state line.

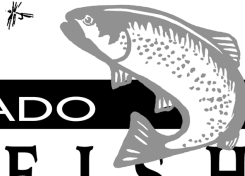
