BACK CAST

OCTOBER MEETING; CASTING FOR RECOVERY

The October meeting topic was Casting for Recovery, who they are, and what is their mission statement. Being in a women's club, you will not have to look far to find someone that has been affected by breast cancer in one way or another, and it is fitting that as a women's flyfishing club, we all have a vested interest in what Casting for Recovery does for women who are faced with a breast cancer diagnosis.

CFR was founded in Manchester, Vermont in 1996 by a breast cancer reconstructive surgeon and a professional flyfisher. and is currently operating in all 50 states, Canada, the United Kingdom, Ireland and New Zealand. It is virtually powered by volunteerism, with only four full-time employees located at the national office.

Flyfishing retreats are the main focus of the organization. Each retreat will teach fourteen women how to fish; Colorado is the only state to host three retreats each year. Currently, the retreats are hosted at The North Fork Ranch, with instruction by volunteers, and professional guides offer their volunteer service as river helpers. Equipment is provided by The Orvis Co. "If you have volunteered in the past, try again! We are working hard to accept all offers." Due to increasing interest, they are currently looking for a western slope facility.

Although these retreats are for women who have personal experience with breast cancer (either currently, or in the past), the discussion is not about the illness. It is about flyfishing — casting, knots, flies, etc. Bearing in mind that the women involved are dealing with an illness, there are support staff on duty at all retreats, including oncologists and psychologists. The focus is not on being ill, but on the future, recovery, and forgetting about being sick for just a short while. In fact, the very motion of fly-casting is a doctor-recommended exercise for the muscles involved in a mastectomy.

Unfortunately, not all women who are interested are given the opportunity to participate. It is an application process, and the national office chooses applicants.

FLY TYERS CORNER

Backstabber Carp Fly (Crayfish) by Jay Zimmerman, Rocky Mountain Anglers



For bass, carp and trout
 Hook: Gamakatsu SL45 #6
 Thread: UNI-Thread 6/0 Tan
 Eyes: Spirit River Dazl-Eyes 1/8 Gold
 Body: Dave Whitlock SLF Dubbing (Red Fox Squirrel Nymph-Abdomen)
 Top: Marabou Blood Quills (Burnt Orange)
 Hackle: Brown Brahma Hen soft hackle

Instructions:

1. Build a solid thread base on center of hook shank.
2. Secure 1/8 Dazl-Eyes dumb bell onto center of hook shank.
3. Wax thread and create dubbing rope. Wind dubbing rope forward, figure eight it around the Dazl-Eyes. Rake out dubbing using velcro or dubbing rake.
4. Tie in two tufts of marabou.
5. Tie in brown soft hackle.
6. Wrap soft hackle four to five times around, tie off and trim.
7. Whip finish and apply head cement.


