**THEO ANEST CLUES US IN ON THE BIG FISH MIGRATION**

Just before our Dream Stream trip, Theo Anest of Colorado Skies Outfitters in Parker will discuss the annual migration of giant cutties and rainbows moving out of Eleven Mile Reservoir into the Dream Stream Section of the South Platte.

This three-mile-long Colorado tail-water section of the South Platte River is nestled in the windswept high-mountain plain of South Park. Flowing out of Spinney Mountain Reservoir, meandering through prime big trout habitat, the river eventually flows into Eleven Mile Reservoir.

Theo will be walking us through the various staging areas for pre-spawn fish, showing how to better see fish in deep holes, how to select flies and hiding spots. Be sure to join us at the meeting for the inside scoop on fishing the Dream Stream.

Theo has been guiding in the area for a number of years. In addition to guiding he has competed and placed in numerous casting competitions. During the social hour be sure to ask him about his techniques. —*Mary Manka, V. P. and Program Chair*

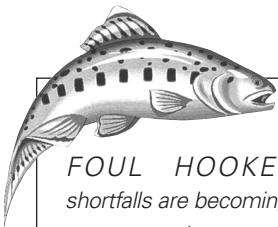

## BACK CAST

### LONDON MAYER STOPS BY THE FEBRUARY MEETING

Old Man Winter was not successful this year at keeping CWF members from our February meeting! Our presenter, Landon Mayer, might have had something to do with it.

It was well worth trudging out in the cold to cash in on Landon's expertise, and his willingness to share it!

I think the temperature of the room must have increased by at least two degrees just from the friction of pen on paper, as members scrambled to keep up with the fast paced program. Don't worry. For all of us who do not know shorthand or could not attend the meeting, Landon is a kind man and all of the information can be found in his new book – phew! It is a compilation of ideas from several of the best guides in the state. Some have been presenters at CWF. It is a steal for the price.

Here are some of the points I found interesting in Landon's presentation. There are a lot of complex hatches in Colorado. During any hatch one food source is always productive. In late June, July and early August, thank the pale morning dun.

#### Tools for the Hunt:

➤ Quality sunglasses — Polarized is a must have so you can see fish. Color is important, too. Copper or brown on sunny days, yellow to copper on dark days. Your vision will change when you change the tint of your sunglasses. Choose a frame with thick side shields to block the glare. A proper fit will reduce or eliminate headaches. Landon's preferences are Oakley and Smith Optics.

➤ Buff® Headware — Absorbs water reflection from the water's surface. Dark colors are preferred: black, green, blue. Light colors will bounce light into your eyes.

➤ Apparel — Dress for the hunt! Trout look up at a 45° angle at their food source, and most often are spooked by movement from above. If you are standing on a snow-covered bank in your dark waders, chances are high that you have just spooked your fish. In fall, dress in bright colors to match the foliage; reds, oranges, yellows. Look around at your environment, and blend.

## **GO FISH THE DREAM STREAM**

**MARCH 10, DAY TRIP**

If you have attended the last two meetings, you are ready to tackle the Dream Stream. This three-mile section of the South Platte River between Spinney Mountain Reservoir and Eleven Mile Reservoir can be both a pain and delight. The landing of a 20+-inch fish can be a delight, but the wind can be a pain. Come prepared with both a camera for the fish and your winter gear for the unpredictable Colorado weather.

### **Equipment and Flies**

Bring a 5 or 6 wt. rod with 4 or 5 wt. leaders and tippet to match. Flies include: midges, RS2s, top secrets, black beauties, jujubee red midge patterns, glo bugs (eggs) orange/peach 22-24, and streamers have been used in the past. Check with your favorite fly shop to see what is going on closer to the trip date.

### **Carpooling**

Meet at the RTD Park 'n Ride on the south-

west corner of Hampden (Highway 285) and Wadsworth Boulevard at 6:45 a.m. We will leave at 7:00 a.m. sharp.

### **Directions**

Drive west on Hwy. 285 to Fairplay. Just past Fairplay go left on Hwy. 9 for 18 miles to a T in the road. Turn left (east) onto Hwy. 24 and continue through the town of Hartsel. Turn right (south) onto 23 Road; at the T turn left onto 592 Road. At 59 Road turn right. There is a free parking area at the bridge. If you arrive later, it will be easy to spot us along the stream. Remember, the fish are moving upstream out of Elevenmile Reservoir towards Spinney Reservoir, so look for most of us to head west and fish back to the bridge. ### **CACHE LA POUFRE RIVER**

**Fort Collins, CO  
Day Trip, Saturday,  
April 21**

The Cache la Poudre River is located northwest of Fort Collins. It is about a two-hour drive from Denver. This is a freestone river (not fed by a dam). The first part of the canyon is steep and narrow but as you travel west, it opens up with several pull-off campgrounds and picnic areas. There are two sections designated as Wild Trout Waters which provide prime fishing.

In April we are hoping to be at the peak of the blue wing olives and possibly the start of the caddis hatch. We will have a trip sign-up sheet and buddy list at the February/March/April meetings. ### **ARKANSAS RIVER, Salida, CO Weekend Trip, May 5-6**

This is the trip everyone looks forward to! You won't want to miss out on this one, as over 50 members and guests battle with the brown trout in the cold waters of the Arkansas River

near Salida. We hope our timing is right for the Mother's Day Caddis Hatch that this river is famous for. Provided that a rogue storm doesn't blow out the river, we generally educate large numbers of these wild brown trout. We plan to have buddy trips.

If you would like the opportunity to be accompanied by an experienced CWF member, please indicate so on the sign-up sheet at meetings or send an email to [Trips@color-womenflyfishers.org](mailto:Trips@color-womenflyfishers.org) at least two days before the trip date, so I have time to arrange one for you. The more experienced member will fish with you and introduce you to other club members. Please remember, they are to be your fishing buddy for two hours, not your guide.

### **Accommodations**

Super 8 Motel in Salida, [salidasuper8.com](http://salidasuper8.com), will provide a reduced room rate of \$74.88 which includes a daily continental breakfast. Tell them you are a CWF Member when you call; their phone number is (719) 539-6689. Other accommodations can be had at the Comfort Inn and White-water Inn (formerly the Rainbow Inn).

There is RV camping at Four Seasons RV Park for those who need hook ups. There is free dry camping 0.5 miles east of Four Seasons along the Arkansas River. ### **Guided Trips**

If you are interested in a guided trip, you can either wade or float with guides from Greg Felt's ArkAnglers Fly Shop. He can set you up to float or wade for either half- or full-day trips. If you are interested in booking a trip, or have questions about guided trips, please contact Greg directly at (719) 539-4223, or email him at [greg@arkanglers.com](mailto:greg@arkanglers.com). He can usually pair you up if you don't have a trip partner; just let him know.

### **What to Bring**

Bring a 4-, 5-, or 6-weight rod (sometimes it can get quite windy and that extra heft is useful) with leaders and tippets down to 5x. Dress in layers and be prepared for all weather conditions. We have encountered a few snowstorms in the past.

We will give more specific details about fly selection in the next issue of the newsletter, but you should start to stock up on caddis (all life stages) and blue wing olives. Many members prefer to take a cooler for lunch in the car and then dine out in the evening.

I am very excited to share the wonderful educational opportunities that each of you as members will be able to take part in this year! We listened...and based on the feedback received in the member poll last fall, have created some new events, as well as modified existing ones, to keep our programs as dynamic and interesting as the ladies in our group.

#### **The 2012 CWF Spring Clinic Beginners: April 28- 29**

Get excited ladies, because our clinics are back this year in full force. This year's Spring Beginner Clinic has been extended to two days! Students will have one full day of classroom instruction as well as a second full day on the water, with instructors, for hands-on application of the techniques learned the previous day. We're teaming up with the outstanding guides from Hook Flyfishing to bring this incredible opportunity for members to learn the art of flyfishing from top-notch instructors. The Clinic will consist of both classroom instruction, and outdoor hands-on instruction. This year we're offering two different levels of casting to suit the wide range of abilities/interests of the students. As a new addition, the final two hours of the day will be an "on the water" instruction for all students, on the pristine private waters of the ranch. The focus during these two hours is for each student to get quality one-on-one time with the instructors. Very recently, Royal-Stephens, Ltd., a local fly shop that donated flies for our raffle has closed, and we can assume that they aren't the only purveyors of fine flyfishing goods who are feeling the pain.

All of us have things we want or need, like Colorado fishing licenses, why not buy quality the first time, and buy local? If nothing comes to mind, visit your local fly shop and I bet you will find something you just can't or don't want to live without. It might even be that inspiration or encouragement to fish a different type of water, or try a different type of fishing (i.e., Czech nymphing), or start tying flies, that you have been waiting for. ■

## From the Presidential Suite

**M**arch is the first month with a Club-sponsored trip and you really want to go on the trip, but these thoughts keep repeating themselves: "OK, I've joined this flyfishing club, now what do I do? What equipment do I need? I've heard it could be expensive and I don't have any extra money ... **HELP!**"

### **WELL, HERE'S SOME HELP!**

**Boots:** You can pick up a pair of boots for as little as \$50, or up through \$200. *Wear thick socks when you try them on, and try them on with the waders.*

**Waders:** You can purchase a pair of breathable waders starting around \$80 to \$90. If you get a pair of chest waders, make sure it has a belt. That belt is important in case you happen to fall in the river.

**Fly Rod:** No, it doesn't have to be four to five hundred dollars! You can get a nice rod for around \$120 to \$150. Five weight, four piece, eight or nine feet is a nice average all-around type of rod.

**Reel & Line:** Reel, about \$60 - \$80, weight forward, floating line for about \$30 will be fine for your first summer. If you buy the reel and line together, ask the fly shop person to put the line on the

reel and ask if they'll put a bright colored butt section on it. This way you'll be able to see the end of your line and the beginning of your leader.

**Vest:** Get a vest that has lots of pockets. Borrow one of the shop's larger fly boxes and make sure it fits into a pocket or two. They're about \$20 and up.

**Net:** Basic net, about \$20

**Sunglasses:** Polarized is best for your eyes; \$10 to \$12 and up.

### **EXTRAS BUT NEEDED:**

**Tippet** - 1 spool each, 4X and 5X should hold you for most areas \$2.50 - \$12.

**Scissors** - or nippers to cut your tippet when tying on a fly.

**Hemostats or Forceps** - \$2.00 and up.

**Question:** To which fly shop should I go to?

**Answer:** Any fly shop on your side of town. Several fly shops will rent their equipment to our Club members. Just show your membership card.

No, you don't have to be a millionaire to flyfish. You just have to have the will and desire to do it! I hope this helps. Happy Shopping!

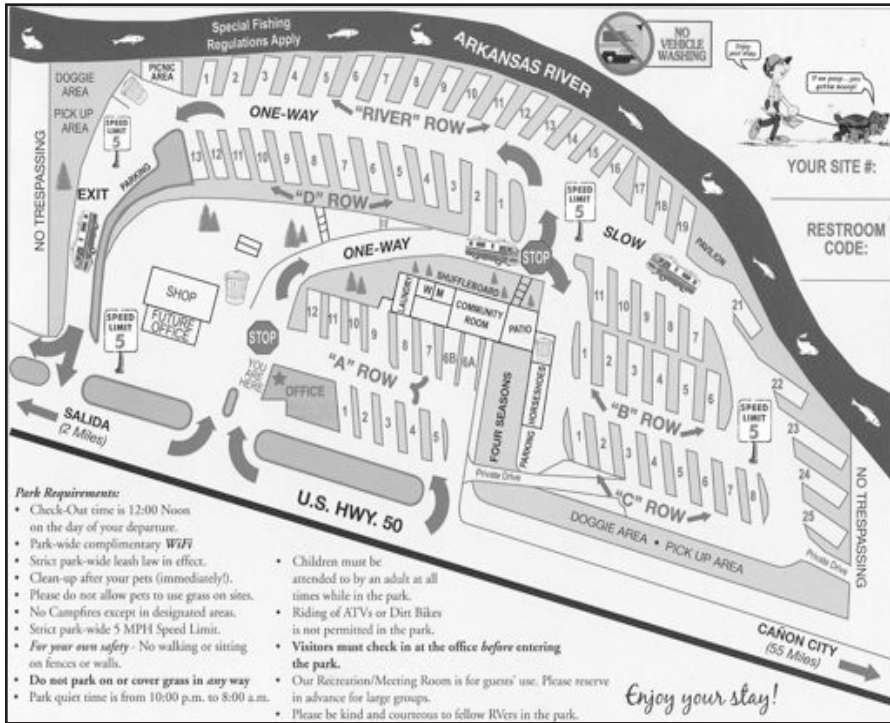

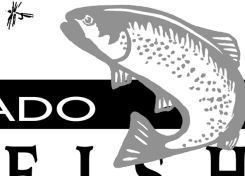
